CENTERED RIDING CLINIC

SRC's Rusty Stirrups Club has organized a clinic with Dawn Ruthven, a Level IV Centered Riding Instructor, taking place from August 7-9. Centered Riding, developed by the late Sally Swift, promotes suppleness, stability and clearer aids, making riding more comfortable for horse and rider.

Dawn Ruthven was born in Srinigar, India, and was riding before she could walk. Her family emigrated to Victoria, B.C., where opportunities for riding were always available, from boarding school – where it was part of the curriculum – to summers spent on a large ranch in the B.C. Interior. Serious showing on the flat and over fences came to an end when she moved to Toronto to obtain her diploma in Occupational Therapy. She feels that the anatomy, kinesiology and psychiatry studied there have been most valuable in her equestrian teaching and judging. After her return to B.C., Dawn became involved in dressage, attending all possible clinics, shows and lessons. As the years went by she started judging both English and Western classes including dressage, hack, equitation, jumper and hunter. She also obtained an AHSA Judges Card.

Dawn was involved with the development of the Canadian Coaching System, examining some of the early candidates. In 1986 she attended her first Centered Riding clinic with Sally Swift. Impressed with the system, she used the principles in her own riding and teaching. In 2000, Dawn was certified at the highest level of Centered Riding instructor.

Riding spots are full, but participants are welcome at the lecture that precedes the riding sessions on Friday, August 7 from 7-9 p.m. in the Clubhouse at a cost of \$10.
