

RESCUE PROGRAM SPONSORSHIP

We are currently seeking individuals or organizations who would be willing to commit to covering the basic costs for one of our Program horses or ponies for a minimum period of twelve (12) months at a cost of \$700 per month.

- **\$200 month training stipend** (does not nearly cover their time but is a token of goodwill to SRC Instructors or handlers who provide training to the horses in our Program)
- **\$250 month feed** (hay, grain, supplements)
- **\$70 month bedding**
- **\$90 month farrier** (assumes half of horses get trim and front shoes only every 6 weeks; half have trim only and no shoes)
- **\$90 month vet** (assumes annual immunizations and teeth floating only)

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The **Southlands Riding Club Rescue and Rehabilitation Program** was established at the Club in October 2015 enabling the Club to make a meaningful difference in the lives of horses and ponies in need of a 'second chance' while also fulfilling the requirements for maintaining farm status.

Program horses and ponies benefit from the training provided by certified SRC instructors or highly-experienced handlers. Each Program horse or pony has a primary trainer/handler responsible for establishing and meeting both short- and long-term goals tailored to the individual needs of the animal. Once fully rehabilitated and deemed ready to graduate from the Program, these horses and ponies are offered for sale to approved homes, making way for a new horse or pony to enter the Program.

Program 'residents' live on-site at the Club in our show stabling facilities. We are in the process of planning for permanent stabling on the property as part of the Club's longterm strategic planning efforts. Care for the ponies/horses is overseen by the Program Coordinator who is supported by an amazing team of volunteers who provide daily feeding, mucking and grooming the Program residents.

The Southlands Rescue & Rehabilitation Program is committed to providing for the needs of all horses and ponies in our care.

VETERINARY & FARRIER CARE

From the initial pre-purchase examination to ongoing care, our horses and ponies have access to the best possible care. We are fortunate to have Meadow Lane Equine Clinic and Sam Suderland Farrier Services as our Program care providers.



HIGH-QUALITY FEED

Many of our Program horses and ponies come to us with special dietary needs due to lack of quality nutrition. Sponsorship dollars help to offset the cost of providing high-quality feed and specialized supplements for improving hoof health, maintaining gut health and more.



PROFESSIONAL TRAINING

Each horse or pony who enters our Program is matched to a Club-sanctioned, certified trainer or a highly-experienced handler. They have primary responsibility for the animal's short- and long-term training goals. Our trainers/handlers set a path for success for our horses and ponies.



EQUIPMENT & SUPPLIES

We are fortunate to receive many donations, but often our horses and ponies require specific training equipment (bits, saddles, pads, etc.) and blankets or care items that we aren't able to acquire second-hand. Having well fitting and safe equipment is a priority for our Program.



PROGRAM MANAGEMENT

Program oversight is provided by our Club's Coordinator who ensure daily care of the horses and ponies, train volunteers, order supplies, schedule professional care and more. Our Training Consultant also helps with training challenges and marketing and sales.
