EC SPORT LICENSING 2024 SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

 The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES:

 Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events.

AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

 Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

COACH STATUS REQUIREMENTS:

- All coaches at EC-sanctioned events require EC Licensed Coach Status. For upgrading from Registered to Licensed Status, coaches can apply for a Temporary Coach Status (TCS) to fulfill the requirement for each event.
- New for 2024: A TCS may be purchased conveniently online via the MyEC Portal only. Each TCS is valid for a single event.

EMPOWERING SELF-COACHED ATHLETES:

 Athletes without a designated coach can declare themselves as self-coached by providing their name and EC Sport Licence number on their entry form.

EQUESTRIAN CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

"Equestrian Canada is committed to: upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities; requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment; ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors, or their agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose; providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure; providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives; continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare; requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition; and reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane."

SITE MAP & GENERAL INFORMATION



Move-in and Move-out Reminders

- Horse trailers and other vehicles are to enter and exit the property using the gates located along 53rd Ave (see yellow circles above) OR Macdonald St (beside indoor arena).
- RV's and trailers with electrical hook-up bookings are to enter the property from the gate near Carnarvon on 53rd Ave and proceed east along the track to their designated spot; please park on an angle as indicated; exit from gate closest to the indoor ring when leaving the show.
- Trailers remaining on-site for the duration of show may park between the track and the fence line along 53rd Ave (signage and volunteers will provide directions).
- Once unloaded, please park all vehicles outside of the property; parking for vehicles is available to the east of the Covered Arena (semi-circular drive), along 53rd Ave (south side of street) and Macdonald St (east side; north of 53rd)
- Clubhouse parking lot is for show staff and volunteers only.

Food and Beverages

• The licensed Clubhouse has hot and cold beverages - including espresso beverages, wine and beer, snacks and light fare (pre-packaged yogurt parfaits, sandwiches, salads, etc.) available for purchase during Show Office hours.

A pre-green hunter is a horse of any age in his first or second year of showing over fences at 3' or higher at any EC/USEF-sanctioned competition. A 1st Year Pre-Green horse is in his first year of showing over fences at 3' or higher and a 2nd Year Pre-Green horse is in his second year of showing over fences at 3' or higher at any EC/USEF-sanctioned competition. A 1st Year Pre-Green horse has never competed over fences of 3' or higher prior to Jan. 1 of the current year at any EC/USEF-sanctioned competition. A 2nd Year Pre-Green horse has never competed over fences higher than 3'5" prior to Jan. 1 of the current year at any EC/USEF sanctioned competition. No Pre-Green hunter may jump 3'6" or higher without jeopardizing their green status. Fences: First Year 3'0", Second Year 3'3" (Article G303)

Open to riders of all ages who are current EC Sport License holders for the level in which they are competing. In addition, for points to count toward a provincial final, riders and their trainers/coaches must be members of the provincial Hunter Jumper association tabulating points for that region. Open to all riders who will not be competing at 3'9" or higher at this horse show. The course will consist of at least 10 fences. A Liverpool is mandatory. A ride off on the flat will be called for. There is no minimum rider requirement. Fences 3'3" (1.00m)

- FEI schooling rules will be used. (Annex 1 National Schooling Rules for Hunter & Jumper).
- All jumper classes will run under EC National Rule: FEI Article 236: elimination after two refusals.
- Jumpers will be scored under Table A-Article 238.
- Immediate jump-off unless otherwise specified.
- Rule for Junior and Amateur jumper riders: A
 horse/rider combination is permitted unlimited
 upward movement, but downward movement is
 restricted to only one level. These movements are
 based on the level of the first class in which they
 competed. (Article G605.4).
- Hors concours (HC): entries will be accepted at the horse show committee's discretion; a horse or pony may only compete HC once in the same ring on the same day. (Article G501.1 & G501.2.).

Specifications

Championships: Will be awarded in divisions with a minimum of three riders. In the case of a tie for the Champion/Reserve, the highest placing in the largest prize money class of the division will be used. If all classes have same prize money, the last class of the division will be used. (Article G506).

Falls: After being eliminated for a fall, the rider may not remount in the ring. Any rider who does remount in the ring after a fall will be eliminated from all classes in that ring for the remainder of the day. A rider who remounts after a fall and takes another obstacle will be disqualified from the remainder of the competition. In the case of a fall of a horse or pony, Article A517.4 will apply. The officiating steward, judge, technical delegate, president of the ground jury or appointed competition veterinarian has the authority to remove a horse from the event for a period of up to 24 hours, if in their reasonable opinion the horse is unfit to compete, or where, in their reasonable opinion, there is a safety concern regarding the horse. The official's decision is final and cannot be appealed. In the case of a fall of an Athlete anywhere within the grounds of the event during the hours of competition operation, the Athlete must be checked by the competition's medical service, before the Athlete may continue to compete in the next round or competition. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the onsite medical assessment takes place. This rule is applicable to all competitors (including foreign) at EC sanctioned events and applies to falls/accidents that occur at the event location. (Article G103).

EQUESTRIAN CANADA VACCINATION RULE

All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of Competition Management.

SINCE 2021 - All horses are required a proof of vaccinations submitted to the Competition Office prior to receiving its show number.

Please attach a proof of vaccination with your entry (pdf or jpeg file).

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

ENTRIES CLOSE

Closing date for the show is midnight (PST) on April 22, 2024.

The 2024 SRC Season Welcomer Hunter-Jumper Horse Shows is sanctioned as a Bronze competition of Equestrian Canada c/o House of Sport 2451 Riverside Drive, Ottawa, Ontario, K1H 7X7 and is governed by the rules of EC (A602.1). Current Horse Council BC and EC Bronze memberships are required. All classes are run as miscellaneous classes and are not rated for EC awards. and are covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book (A602.2) EC Horse Recordings are not required.

MANAGEMENT

The Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions regarding, arising out of, or incident to the SRC Horse Show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered by these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management and their decision is final. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders exhibitors, prohibit claim damages; to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges, and to change specifications in jumper classes.

ENTRIES

EC, HC AND BCHJA MEMBERSHIPS

All owners, riders, lessees and trainers must be current members of Horse Council BC and hold a minimum of a current EC Bronze membership. For competitors wishing to collect BCHJA year end points at BCHJA sanctioned competitions, all riders and trainers/coaches must be current members of BCHJA.

EC/HC ENTRY AGREEMENT

By signing the entry form you agree to the following statement:

"I hereby certify that every horse, rider and/or driver is eligible as entered and agree for myself and my representatives to be bound by the Constitution and rules of Equine Canada at this competition. It is hereby recognized that all equestrian sports involve inherent risk and that no helmet or protective equipment can protect against all foreseeable injury. I hereby accept this risk and hold harmless EC, the competition, their officials, organizers, agents, employees and their representatives. The person responsible (PR) agrees to the release of any information on the entry form to EC." (A802.4). In the event that an exhibitor participates in an Equine Canada sanctioned competition where approved headgear is required for juniors, he/she will wear a properly fitted, ASTM or BSI/BS EN approved helmet. It is understood that competitors not meeting this requirement will not be allowed to compete at these competitions. Per Article A801, every entry at an EC Sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. A person responsible (PR) must sign the competition entry form. PR must be an EC Sport License holder in good standing OR in the case of junior entries, a parent/guardian is entitled to sign as PR. Art A213.2. In the case of USEF member entries PR must be a USEF member in good standing.

SAFE SPORT

When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.

ENTRY PROCEDURE

For each horse entered please complete a separate entry form to include owner and rider information (entries may be made in the name of a farm/stable provided the name is registered with EC), all membership numbers, signatures, payment for: classes entered, stabling or haul-in fees, exhibitor fees, drug fees, GST and warm-up fees if required. Membership cards must be presented at check in, or copies sent with entry forms.

Payment can be made with a credit card with the entry on-line at www.horseshowtime.com or paid with a cheque, payable to Southlands Riding Club - in Canadian Funds - mailed or dropped off with the entry form to Southlands Riding Club, 7025 Macdonald Street, Vancouver, BC, V6N 1G9.

JUNIOR AGES

Individuals are juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18.

Junior "A" – a rider who is 15, 16, or 17 on January 1, 2024.

Junior "B" – a rider who is 12, 13, or 14 on January 1, 2024.

Junior "C" – a rider who is 11 or under on January 1, 2024. Article G1006.2

NUMBERS

Numbers will NOT be issued unless all signatures are in place, all memberships are current and listed, and all fees have been paid by cheque or with credit card. This includes fully paid current owner, rider and trainer, Horse Council and EC memberships, all signatures, and all entries paid in full. A credit card number or an open cheque must be left with the entry secretary if competitors wish to add classes during the competition. Equitation riders not riding their own horse must sign the form (and have a parent or guardian sign if a junior rider) for the horse they are riding and use that horse's number.

Every entry must be provided an identification number by the competition organizing committee which must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling and/or exercise areas as well as in the competition ring. Article A814

RETURNED PAYMENT

Cheques returned by the bank for any reason will be assessed a penalty of \$50.00. Payment must be repaid within 10 days and be paid by certified cheques, money order, cash, Visa or Mastercard and must include the \$50.00 fee.

POST ENTRIES

Entries received after midnight (PST) on April 22, 2024, but prior to the start of the show will be subject to a \$35.00 late-entry fee. Entries received after the start of the show will be subject to a \$50.00 late-entry fee.

SUBSTITUTIONS

With a veterinarian's certificate, a new horse may be substituted for a scratched horse. There will be a \$25.00 substitution fee and all monies will be transferred to the new horse.

ADD/SCRATCHES: CHANGE POLICY

- ALL entries will be charged a one-time \$20.00 fee for adding, scratching or changing classes.
- A credit card or open cheque must be left at the show office before any add/scratch/changes will be processed.
- Any class adds, scratches, or changes MUST be made in the show office in writing no later than 30 minutes following the last class the day before the class is scheduled.

SAME DAY CLASS ADD, SCRATCH, CHANGES

- Scratching or changing a class at the gate will not constitute an official scratch or change. Scratches and changes MUST be made in the office before the start of the class for a full refund.
- Same day class adds will be charged a \$5.00 fee per class.
- Classes CAN NOT be added or changed once the class starts.
- Competitors that go into a class without entering will pay double the fee of the class.

REFUNDS

- CANCELLATION BEFORE CLOSING DATE Before closing date of entries a full refund will be given.
- CANCELLATION AFTER CLOSING DATE BUT BEFORE THE START OF THE HORSE SHOW -STALL FEES WILL NOT BE REFUNDED. Upon the presentation of a Vet Slip to the entry secretary the entry fees, exhibitor fees, and warm up fees will be refunded, minus an office fee of \$25 or 15% whichever is greater.
- CANCELLATION AFTER THE START OF THE HORSE SHOW Upon presentation of a Vet Slip to the entry secretary, class fees for the classes that have not been shown in, will be refunded, minus a \$25 or 15% fee whichever is greater. Stall fee and exhibitor fees will not be refunded.

NON-SHOWING FEE

There will be a \$100.00 fee for all horses not entered in any classes at the competition. This non-showing fee allows use of the warm-up rings. All non-showing horses are required to sign the entry waiver and wear a number. Show Management reserves the right to refuse stabling for non-showing horses in the event of a wait list.

EXHIBITOR FEE

All entries will be charged a \$40.00 fee.

CHECK OUT

Show bills may not be disputed after the show office closes on the final day of the event. Please check your bill PRIOR to leaving the show. Credit cards on file will be billed at end of show; if payment is declined there will be a \$50.00 NSF fee charged.

HORSE RECORDINGS

Horse Recordings are not required at SRC Bronze-rated competitions.

DRUG AND MEDICATION RULE

Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control while at the event location. All showing horses will be charged a \$4.00 drug fee. This fee will be forwarded directly to Equestrian Canada. Article A1008.1.

BARN BILLS & TRAINER SPLITS

Trainers requiring barn bills must set them up at the beginning of the horse show with a credit card or open cheque. Trainer splits must be done by no later than Saturday at noon.

HAUL-IN FEE

Horses that are not renting a stall and are trailering in and out must pay a haul-in fee of \$20.00 per horse per day.

RV PARKING

Limited electrical-only hook-up for camping available at a cost of \$185.00 per show plus GST. Please call the Club Office at 604-263-4817 to make arrangements. Dry camping is available at no charge but must be prearranged with the Club Office.

SCHOOLING

See prize list for details and pricing. Numbers must be worn for schooling. Riders wishing to show only on schooling day may do so, but must fill out a waiver, obtain a number and pay appropriate fees in the show office before schooling. Adults are permitted to ride ponies in schooling areas and in non-judged warm-up rounds. FEI schooling rules will be used.

VACCINATIONS

All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations.

BIOSECURITY

Southlands Riding Club is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all exhibitors and their horses. All horses are required to have a BioSecurity Form (located online and at back of Prize Book) submitted to the show office prior to receiving their competition number. All show participants are requested to practice good disease prevention practices. All horses entering the show grounds must not have been in contact with any sick horses within the last 15 days. Any horse that has been sick or exposed to an infectious disease within the last 15 days must have their attending veterinarian contact Southlands Riding Club prior to entry to the show grounds. We ask that any horse with a rectal temperature above 38.5 C (101.8 F) be reported to show management. Any horse identified to have or is suspected of having a contagious disease will be removed to the isolation area. Please avoid any direct or indirect contact between horses, in particular nose to nose contact and use of any common feed/drinking buckets. The early detection of any contagious disease is the key to prevention of a disease outbreak. We appreciate your cooperation and look forward to everyone having a successful horse show experience.

STABLING and CLEAN OUT

Portable stalls available on the grounds at a cost of \$225.00 per stall plus GST (4 bags of shavings included). Tack stalls are available at \$200.00 plus GST and Day Stalls are available for \$100 (no shavings included); both are available in limited number and the show reserves the right to limit their allocation accordingly. Stabling opens at noon on the day prior to warm-up day. A \$50.00 clean-stall deposit must accompany each horse AND tack stall booked; if stall is broom-swept clean upon departure (including all hay, garbage, etc.) AND the office is notified, the deposit fee will not be charged. Additional shavings may be purchased from the Show Office during show hours. Barns or exhibitors requiring early arrival, please call Nayda at 604-839-8292 to make arrangements.

BEDDING

Additional bedding is available from the Show Office during show hours only. Please ensure you place your orders early in the day to ensure delivery within the same day.

MANURE

Manure must be placed in the designated area. Trash must be kept separate from manure and placed in appropriate receptacles.

HAY & FEED

Hay/feed is not available for purchase at the competition. Competitors are encouraged to arrange delivery with Westway Feed or other local providers if they do not wish to bring their own supplies with them to the show. Deliveries will not be accepted until 9:00am on the day prior to warm-up day for the competition.

EC PROTOCOL

CONCUSSION

Accidents & Return to Play rule: In the event of a fall/accident where a concussion can be reasonably suspected, the competitors must receive medical clearance by qualified medical personnel on-site before continuing to compete. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the on-site medical assessment takes place. Should a competitor refuse to be evaluated, they will be disqualified from the competition. If on-site qualified medical personnel suspect a concussion or believe the competitor may be at risk of concussion due to the nature of the fall or impact, the competitor will be suspended from competition and placed on a Medical Suspension List until medically released. Competitors will remain on the EC Medical Suspension List until they submit an EC Return to Play Form, signed by a licensed physician, to EC. No competitor shall compete at EC sanctioned competitions while on the EC Medical Suspension List and competition organizers may refuse entry to anyone currently on the list.

FALLS

All competitors that have had a fall during training/warm up on the Competition site or in the Competition Arena/Field of Play must be assessed by qualified medical personnel onsite before they either take part in another test or competition. Competitors must not re-mount their horse until this assessment has been completed. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the onsite medical assessment takes place by the onsite qualified medical personnel. Section A General Rules 101.2

ABUSE

Abuse of the horse is strictly forbidden. Abuse includes, but is not restricted to, excessive use of spurs, abuse of the whip and brutal use of the reins during halts or rein backs, repeated tugs on the horse's mouth.EC Section A, General Rules 517.

PROTESTS

Should any questions or disputes arise which are not provided for in the rulebooks, they shall be referred to the Show Committee whose decision will be final.

ATTIRE

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR

At all EC-sanctioned competitions, anyone mounted on a horse, including foreign competitors, must wear approved equestrian headgear, with safety harness correctly fastened, at all times. Article G102.1 Juniors showing any horse in a jog for soundness must wear approved protective headwear with the attached safety harness fastened.

DRESS

All competitors must be properly dressed in the confines of the arena. This includes the inspection of the course and at the presentation of prizes. Black or brown smooth leather half chaps are permissible providing they match the boot color. In jumper competitions open-neck polo shirts are allowed. No sweatshirts, t-shirts, tank tops or other similar dress will be permitted. Shirts must be neatly tucked into riding breeches. Article G109

EARPHONES AND EARBUDS

Earphones/Earbuds and/or other electronic communication devices are strictly prohibited in the competition arena, and such usage is penalized by elimination.

The use of only one earphone/earbud is allowed while mounted everywhere within the grounds of the Event except the competition arena. When mounted, only hands-free communication is permitted at SRC. Article G114.4

AWARDS

RIBBONS AND CHAMPIONSHIPS

All hunter, jumper and equitation classes will be placed 1st through 8th. Championships will be awarded in divisions of 3 competitors or more.

PRIZE MONEY

Prize money in regular classes will be divided as follows: 1st place-40%, 2nd place-30%, 3rd place-20%, 4th place-10%. Special classes will state the money breakdown in each class specification. Prize money will be paid in Canadian funds. All prize money will be put as a credit to the appropriate account, and anything owing will be deducted. The remaining prize money will be paid to the owner listed on the entry form unless other arrangements have been made. Prize money will be mailed within 30 days from the last day of the conclusion of the competition.

GENERAL INFORMATION

LIABILITY

All owners and competitors and trainers are personally responsible for damages to persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. The owners and competitors and trainers MUST have third party insurance to provide full coverage for participation in equestrian events at any of the SRC Hunter Jumper Shows. Neither Southlands Riding Club Holdings nor their organizing committee, board of directors, sponsors, employees, volunteers nor contractors shall be in any way liable for any accident, injury, death, damage, loss or any other matter that may happen, from any causes or circumstances whatsoever to competitors, exhibitors, or members of their family or their agents, or to any animal or article exhibited or to any property brought on to Southlands Riding Club property, or for any other loss, claim, matter, circumstance or event whatsoever in connection with or arising out of or attributable to any of the SRC Hunter Jumper Horse Shows.

HORSE COUNCIL OF BRITISH COLUMBIA DISCLAIMER

"It is the responsibility of the show/event committee, or organizers and the facility owners and managers to ensure that all BC Health Authority, viaSport and WorkSafeBC directives are followed and enforced. Please follow all vaccination requirements as dictated by your Regional Health Authority. Horse Council is not a regulatory body and it is understood and agreed that sanctioning and approval of either a HCBC Provincial circuit event or Equestrian Canada Bronze or Silver competition relates to the use of the rule book and approved officials only".

This Competition is a Horse Council BC provincially sanctioned Competition and will be governed in accordance with the Horse Council BC Rule Book. Knowledge of the Rules is the responsibility of the Competitor.

The horse show office will be open Thursday from 8:00am to 6:00pm. During horse show days, the office will open one hour before the first class and until 30 minutes following the last class each day.

SMOKING

No smoking permitted anywhere on SRC property/grounds.

FARRIER

A Farrier will be on the show grounds the days of the show and on call for warm-up day.

DOGS

All dogs must be on a controlled leash on the show grounds. Absolutely no dogs in the schooling or show arenas at any time.

LUNGING

No free lunging at any time in any of the arenas. A designated lunging area will be provided. Helmets must be worn while lunging at SRC.
