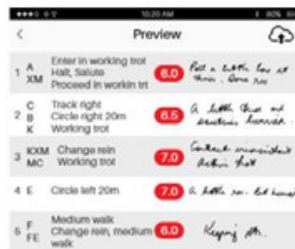
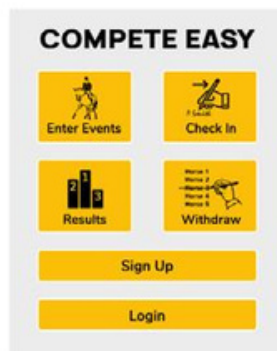

“Equestrian Canada is committed to: upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities; requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment; ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors, or their agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose; providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure; providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives; continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare; requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization’s rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition; and reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The Rising Stars Equitation Program was developed and continues to be overseen by the Rising Stars Youth Dressage Committee established in 2004 in Chilliwack, British Columbia. In 2019 the Rising Stars Equitation program was recognized by Equestrian Canada as a Dressage Youth Development program.

Objectives:

To assist in the development in the improvement and in the continuing advancement of the equitation skills required by Youth Dressage riders by providing an ongoing evaluation of their equitation skills during the performance of a technical dressage test. The improvement of equitation skills is the best pathway to develop Youth Dressage riders toward the higher levels.

Description:

A Dressage Equitation Judge will use the *Rising Stars Youth Dressage Equitation Score Sheet* to evaluate the rider based solely on rider skills during a technical dressage test. The Rising Stars Equitation Program is for all Youth Dressage Riders, up to and including 25 years of age.

Two (2) Judge system: The Judge at C will be judging the technical test. The second Judge at B will be judging the equitation test. The Equitation Judge can be added to a scheduled technical class.

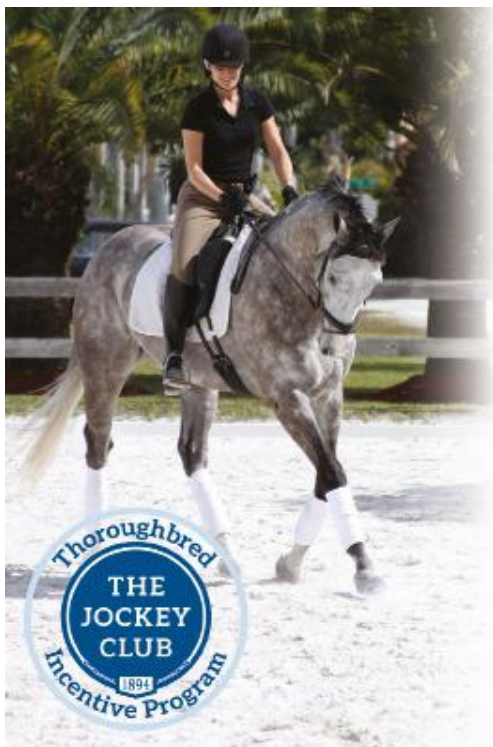

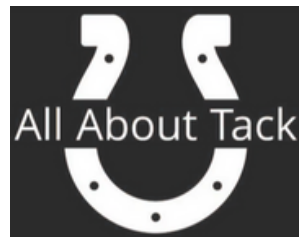

Awards Criteria

- Ribbons awarded in all classes for 1st to 6th place; prizes awarded to 1st place
- Ribbons and prizes may be picked in the Clubhouse after the class is completed and scores posted; the office is opened one hour before first scheduled ride time, and closed one hour after the last class of the day.
- Champions and Reserve Champions for each level as listed below (minimum 3 riders for Championships prizes; if less than three, ribbons awarded only). Categories offered for the Southlands Spring Dressage Show will be Junior, Amateur and Open. Divisions may be combined based on EC rules.
- Championship Awards can be picked up from the Show Office on Sunday afternoon.
- **Championship Introductory to Fourth Level:** Awarded based on the combined total of the top 2 percentage technical scores from the designated Championship (C) Classes (scores Test 2 & Test 3).
- **Championship Western Dressage:** Awarded based on the combined total of the top 2 percentage technical scores from the designated Championship (C) Classes (scores Test 2 & Test 3). Subject to entries, all levels may be combined.
- **Championship FEI Para Equestrian:** Combined scores from both Championship (C) classes. Team and Individual count towards championships.
- Championships and Reserve Championships will be awarded once they are confirmed and posted on the scoreboard on Sunday after last class is finished.
- Competitors leaving show grounds prior to posting awards will forfeit all Championship Awards. Competitors leaving grounds may designate another individual to collect Championship Awards on their behalf prior to leaving grounds.
- Any decisions regarding Championship Results not specified herein the Prize List, which may result in a decision or ruling, will be at the sole discretion of the Show Manager and Dressage Committee.
- **High Score of the Show** will be awarded based on scores from Friday and Saturday. Freestyle and Young Horse class scores will not count towards High Score. Winners will be posted by Sunday morning, and winners are to be present for awards on Sunday. If unable to attend award presentation, they forfeit their prize.
- **Freestyle Highscore** will be posted Friday evening after all freestyles are completed.

The Fine Print

- The percentages obtained by each competitor in both Championship “C” tests shall be totalled. The competitor with the highest total will be named champion. The competitor with the second highest total shall be declared the reserve champion.
- Categories offered for the Southlands Spring Dressage Show will be Junior, Adult Amateur and Open. Championships will be awarded for categories with minimum of 3 competitors per division. Divisions may be combined.
- Any test that receives a score of less than 50% on a technical test will not be eligible for any class awards, championships or reserve championships.
- Show rings will be open for schooling each day after the last class is finished (schooling horses only).
- The rider is responsible for their own errors and those of their agents in the completion of their entry forms.

In this Show whips (subject to compensating aids for para dressage riders (E4.8.2, E6.11.3) and callers are allowed in the Championship (C) Classes with an exception for the Youth Panel Classes (no whips and no callers, qualifier for NAYC).

ONLINE ENTRY 101

What do you need to have ready before to complete your entry online?



1

Make sure you have your EC and PTSO (HCBC) membership numbers. You will need an EC Gold Licence to register for the Southlands Spring Dressage Show and BC Dressage Championships. If you don't have a Gold Licence you can ask for a temporary sport licence or upgrade your licence on equestrian.ca.

2

Have your horse owner's EC and PTSO (HCBC) membership numbers.

3

Have your horse recording number. You can ask for a temporary horse registration when you are doing your online entry.

4

Have a proof of your horse's vaccination (pdf or jpeg file for upload). All horses attending EC sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (I&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event.

5

Fill in and save a digital copy (pdf or jpeg file for upload) of the EC and SRC waivers.

6

Know the numbers of the classes you wish to enter.

7

Have your credit card information with you (Visa and Mastercard accepted).

ENTRIES

- 1. Entries close ON SATURDAY May 13th AT MIDNIGHT.** Entries received after closing date are subject to post-entry fees.
- 2.** One horse/rider per entry.
- 3.** Entries must be completed online at competeeasy.com. If you cannot enter online, you may email your entry and all relevant forms to events@southlandsridingclub.com for a \$50 entry fee.
- 4.** All horses attending an Equestrian Canada sanctioned competition must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Sanction A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations. (A602.8) A vaccination record, invoice or other must be included with the online entry form (PDF, JPEG or PNG file accepted).
- 5.** All competitors must sign the waivers online or send them by email to be added to your online entry for a \$50 fee.
- 6.** Entry confirmations will be emailed automatically by compete easy when entry is completed. **Any change in an entry after closing date, will be charged \$10 per change.**
- 7.** The Show Committee and SRC management reserve the right to limit the number of entries and/or refuse any entry; split, cancel or combine and/or adjust classes or awards; govern all conditions of the show; and make decisions upon any matters not covered by current FEI and or EC rules.
- 8.** Times will be available on Wednesday before the show on our website – www.southlandsridingclub.com and on competeeasy.com.
- 9.** The show will try to accommodate each horse rider combination as best as possible to allow for suitable warm up time for all tests a rider has entered. A minimum of 30 minutes between start of ride times will be scheduled if and where possible. In cases where this is not feasible in the ride schedule, affected riders will be given the option of accepting the available ride time or being removed from the class.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1.** The 2023 Spring Dressage Show is sanctioned as a Gold competition member of Equestrian Canada, c/o House of Sport, 2451 Riverside Drive, Ottawa, Ontario, K1H 7X7 and is governed by the rules of EC. (A602.1)
- 2.** Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book (A602.2). For all FEI classes the 2022 Tests will be used. FEI Para Equestrian will use current tests. All other classes will use the current EC/USEF National Tests.
- 3.** As per Art. A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition (A602.7).
- 4.** Neither Southlands Riding Club (SRC) nor the Show Committee will be held responsible in any way for damage, injury or loss to persons, horses or property of spectators, owners, riders or grooms.
- 5.** Safety Headgear - all riders, regardless of age or level or competition, must wear ASTM/SEI or BSI/BS EN approved protective headgear at all times when mounted at any EC-sanctioned Dressage competition at the event location.
- 6.** Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location (A602.5). All showing horses will be charged a \$8.00 drug fee.
- 7.** All riders must be current members of Equestrian Canada, Dressage Canada, and HCBC or AEF. A Gold license is required for Gold shows or temporary sport license fees apply. Foreign competitors must be members of their National Equestrian Federation.
- 8.** RING SIZE: All tests will be held in a 20x60 ring with the exception of FEI PE Grade 1, 2 and 3 which may be ridden in a 20 x 40 ring. Warm-up rings 20x60 or larger. Rings and ride-times available online Wednesday prior to show.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

9. All Canadian entries are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and have paid the EC Horse Recording annual Activation Fee to compete, or if owned by a temporary sport license holder, a Temporary Horse Registration form must be purchased. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit verifying the horse (See Art. A404 and A405).
10. ****NEW SINCE 2022**** When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.
11. **BIOSECURITY:** Southlands Riding Club is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all exhibitors and their horses. **All horses are required to have a BioSecurity Form ([CLICK HERE to download](#)) submitted to the show office prior to receiving their competition number.** All show participants are requested to practice good disease prevention practices. Travelling and showing horses are at an increased risk for contracting and spreading contagious diseases. All horses entering the show ground must not have been in contact with any sick horses within the last 15 days.
12. Any horse that has been sick or exposed to an infectious disease within the last 15 days must have their attending veterinarian contact the Southlands Riding Club veterinarian prior to entry to the show grounds. All horses while on the show ground are expected to have their temperatures taken and recorded on a daily basis during the show. Please have temperature records available upon request. We ask that any horse with a rectal temperature above 38.5 C (101.8 F) be reported to show management and/or show veterinarian immediately. The show veterinarian will examine any horses with an elevated temperature or other signs of illness prior to being allowed to show. Any horse identified to have or is suspected of having a contagious disease will be removed to the isolation area. We ask that braiders/grooms/riders use the hand sanitizers, provided in the stall area after handling any horse. Please avoid any direct or indirect contact between horses, in particular nose to nose contact and use of any common feed/drinking buckets. The early detection of any contagious disease is the key to prevention of a disease outbreak. Thank you for your cooperation.
13. Whips may be carried in all tests to a maximum length of 120cm (including lash) and Ponies 100cm maximum length (including lash). Lunge whips are permitted only when lunging in designated area. **Whips are NOT allowed in Youth Panel classes.**

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 14.** Lunging is only permitted in the lunge rings located north of the indoor arena. **Helmets must be worn while lunging and horses must be on a lunge line.**
- 15.** Callers are allowed in EC National level tests. Competitors must provide their own callers. **Callers are NOT allowed in Youth Panel classes**
- 16.** Legboots & bandages: according to the EC Art. E4.9 A: ALLOWED IN WARM-UP AREA ONLY - FORBIDDEN IN COMPETITION.
- 17.** The horse's competition number must be worn and visible at all times while on SRC property and while outside of stall.
- 18.** Dogs must be leashed and under control at all times, if found off leash owners are subject to a fine. All dog owners are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs.
- 19.** SCHOOLING HORSE ENTRIES: Permitted for the duration of the competition. Must pay the Haul In fee of \$35.00 + GST per day if not stabled on the grounds (does not include SRC members). All EC rules and show fees are applicable (except EC Sport License, Drug testing fee and levy fees not required). Schooling horse entries must complete all entry forms and be received prior to the closing date to avoid late fees. Schooling horse will be assigned an entry number which must be worn at all times when outside of stall and on the competition grounds. Competing horses will be given priority for stabling. Non-competing horses may attend with payment of the admin fee and stabling fees if required.
- 20.** Hors concours rides are allowed at the discretion of the show manager and show committee.
- 21.** All prize money will be paid in Canadian funds and will be applied against outstanding show balances with residual issued to the horse owner within 30 days of the competition.
- 22.** Substitution: With a Veterinarian's certificate, a new horse may be substituted for a scratched horse. There will be a \$25+GST substitution fee and all monies will be transferred to the new horse.

CLASS RULES

1. Classes may be scheduled at any time on the day listed in the class schedule. Ride times will only be changed in the case of error, overlapping times, or to facilitate the running of the show.
2. Check EC Rule Book Sec E 3.4.2 Amateur status. For Junior status see 3.4.3, FEI Junior and Young Rider definitions see 3.4.4. You must have Amateur on your EC card to be eligible for this division, otherwise you will be considered an Open rider.
3. USEF Western Dressage tests use: © 2023 United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF) Reprinted with the permission of USEF. All rights reserved. Reproduction without permission is prohibited by law. USEF is not responsible for any errors or omissions in the publication or for the use of its copyrighted materials in any unauthorized manner.
4. Each horse is limited to **a maximum of four (4) tests per day in Training and First Level and a maximum of three (3) test per day for Second level and higher.**
5. Scratches must notify the Show Office.
6. Only **one test of choice per class** may be entered in all Test of Choice (ToC) classes. ToC classes are awarded on total percentages for all tests.
7. Classes will be split (AA/JR/O) if more than five (5) entries per split. Divisions/categories may be combined based on EC rules.
8. FREESTYLE CLASS: Music will be accepted in CD or MP3 format. Music must be provided to the Show office prior to the day of the show. Sound check will take place on Thursday evening - time TBA.
9. Western Dressage: Rider to specify which test will be ridden, either HCBC Western Dressage tests or WDAA tests.



EQUESTRIAN CANADA VACCINATION RULE

All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of Competition Management.

SINCE 2021 - All horses are required a proof of vaccinations submitted to the Competition Office prior to receiving its show number.

Please upload a proof of vaccination with your entry (pdf or jpeg file).

REFUNDS/POST ENTRIES

1. Prior to closing date, all fees will be refunded except the administration fee. After closing date, 50% of class fees will be refunded; stabling and administration fees will not be refunded, even with vet or doctor notes. Cancellation after Thursday May 23rd: no refunds.
2. Post Entry Fees of \$45.00 + GST per entry will be added to any entries received after the closing date. Post entries will only be accepted if space is available.
3. Entries received prior to the closing date, after the competition is full, will be put on a waiting list. They will **not** be subject to post entry fees if/when they are accepted into the show. If the competitor does not wish to be on a waiting list or does not get into the show, all entry fees will be refunded.

STABLING

1. Limited portable stabling will be available on the competition grounds. Stalls will be available on the day prior to the event until two hours following the end of event for a fee of \$225.00+GST (4 bags of shavings provided), and are assigned to rider/ horse. Payment for stalls must accompany entries and is non-refundable once stalls are assigned. Additional days are available at \$100.00 + GST/day and \$115.00 + GST/overnight and must be indicated on the entry form.
2. To ensure stabling as a group, please state with whom you wish to be stabled on your entry form.
3. Additional shavings will be available for purchase on the grounds at a cost of \$10.00/bag + GST.
4. **CLEAN-OUT DEPOSIT:** A \$50.00 + GST stall clean out deposit is required for all stabled horses. This deposit will be charged and then refunded if the stall assigned is stripped clean prior to the exhibitor leaving the show grounds.
5. Tack stalls may be available at the rate of \$200.00 + GST. Tack stalls must be reserved and indicated on entry form.
6. Stall charts will be posted in stabling areas. Please note that stabling is assigned and any changes must be approved by the Competition Manager.

PHOTOGRAPHIC/VIDEO IMAGE RELEASE

The competitor understands that SRC will be gathering photographic and video images and recordings during this event, which images and recordings may include the competitor. The competitor agrees that those images and recordings are the sole and exclusive property of SRC and hereby consent to SRC's release and reproduction of all photographic and video images, recordings and likenesses taken during its events for future promotional or commercial purposes, without any notice or compensation to the competitor.

TRAILER & RV PARKING

1. Trailer parking is on a first come first serve basis and trailers must park in designated locations only.
 2. Horse Trailers can be parked in the street parking area along 53rd (on the south side of the street), or in the grass area immediately north of the show stabling (limited space available, angle parking only). If you require staff assistance or directions, please contact the SRC office upon arrival (604-263-4817). Once unloaded, **please park all vehicles outside of the show grounds**. Parking for vehicles is available to the east of the Covered Arena (semi-circular drive), along 53rd Avenue (south side of street) and Macdonald Street (east side; north of 53rd).
 3. Free tent camping and **limited RV electric hook-ups available (\$95.00+GST/show)**. Please inquire with SRC office.

OFFICE HOURS

Regular hours: Monday to Saturday 9:00 to 5:00. Show hours: the office is opened one hour before first scheduled ride time, and closed one hour after the last class of the day.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE AT SRC

1. Vehicles are NOT allowed to enter the property. With an exception on arrival and departure days. Please enter and exit the property using the gates located along 53rd Avenue, or the gate located just north of the Indoor arena on Macdonald Street (see map).
2. Clubhouse parking lot is for show staff and volunteers only.

FOR THE SAFETY AND CONSIDERATION OF YOUR FELLOW EXHIBITORS

Trailer access to stabling area will be restricted to the following times:

Warm up day: all day access.

Competition days: prior to 7:30 am and after completion of show.

We also ask that spectators stay clear of in-gates, and well back from arena fencing.

1. The Clubhouse has sandwiches, salads, hot and cold beverages, snacks (protein bars, fruit, candy, chips, etc.) available for purchase, as well as complimentary coffee and breakfast snacks during Show Office hours.
